

ENJOYING LIFE IN THE BATHROOM ...

The angled shape of the brush body helps when sweeping in corners, while the split horsehair spares no crumb or grain of dust. The ergonomic handle made of oiled oak wood makes it easy to hold - be sure you don't hide it in the cupboard! The set looks great hanging on the kitchen wall. Several other specialized brushes that many have been waiting for are finally here: the robotic lawn mower brush set on a ring, a special garden upholstery brush (quickly remove dirt, pollen and leaves from upholstery!) and - perfect gift for bread bakers! - our fermenting basket brush not only makes life easier, it also looks great. ... and why didn't we come up with the idea of inventing a dishwashing brush with a scratch-free wooden edge to remove stubborn residue from the baking tray, for example?

Small highlight: The new lint comb uses mineral-coated fabric and works wonders on soft textiles such as wool and cashmere. Big highlights: To create basic order in the hallway, shed, corridor or kitchen, we have come up with wall mounts made from beautifully oiled beech wood. These look great in combination with our ingeniously simple boot holder, which is perfect for drying winter boots, rubber boots or riding boots (we copied this from skiing ...). But our new kitchen textiles are also worth a look: beautiful, elegant fabric, great quality.

Aren't they adorable? Our new, completely self-designed and manufactured children's nail brushes are just the right size for small children's hands who have yet to learn how to clean their nails. The individual motifs are lovingly handdrawn illustrations that are lasered onto the wooden body. Also means: only wood, bristle and linseed oil, no chemicals or paint involved! Their big sisters, our new oak nail and massage brushes, have also become real beauties, we think. The great grain in the oak wood comes out even better when the brushes are used wet, which of course they don't mind. However, we have fallen in love with our new gray-green water pitcher, which also comes with a storage tray. Together with warm wood tones such as oiled beech or oak, this is a dream team for us in the bathroom and is always a little moment of joy when we walk in.

MY FAVORITE REDECKER PRODUCT

Essential in the garden!

Instead of Gernot's short column, we would like to introduce a new section here in future: A variety of lovely people from our area will describe what their favorite Redecker product is — and why. Today we start with Claudia from our agency with her beloved garden tool brush (312629):





"We can no longer do without the garden tool brush when gardening — in our large garden in the country, we are actually busy all year round. All garden tools are now cleaned quickly, easily and conveniently straight after use — that wasn't always the case before ;-) Even wet soil is no problem! The integrated scraper is great if something gets stuck.

I also use the brush — like so many other Redecker brushes — for other things in the house and garden — brushing flower pots, cleaning rubber boots … Despite constant use, the garden tool brush still looks almost as good as new. Very durable!"

What a day! When we tried out the new pasta tools in the Redecker test kitchen (which is our own at home;-), we quickly realized: We have a new passion! We don't need complicated pasta machines, just our hands and excellent hand tools made of wood and food-safe aluminum or stainless steel. We found the contact with the product – the dough – just right and wonderfully relaxing, almost meditative!

Our pasta tools come directly from Italy and are also made there. Where else would they come from? Incidentally, the legend that explorer Marco Polo actually brought pasta to Italy from Asia is not true: pasta already existed in Europe before his time, probably even long before the turn of the millennium in the year 0.

There are countless dough recipes for homemade fresh pasta (which simply cannot be compared with conventional dried industrial pasta).

Here is ours:

Pasta al Jana
(for 8 persons)

400 g flour (type 405)

75 g durum wheat semolina

12 egg yolks (size £)

4 tbsp cold water

2 tsp extra virgin olive oil

The dough is kneaded, left 30 min. to rest and then rolled out flat with a rolling pin to suit the type of pasta. Then, for example, the ingenious rolling pins (the name is right!) are used to cut the pasta dough into more or less narrow strips for pappardelle, tagliatelle or 3mm spaghetti (our favorite!). Depending on the recipe and desired consistency, dry the pasta strips briefly on the pasta dryer before placing them in boiling salted water never use too little water, never put the lid on! After two to four minutes, the pasta is ready and jumps out of the pot straight into the sauce prepared in the pan.

Our favorites:

- Good (!) sea salt butter, pepper, salt, fresh sage (al burro da salvia ...)
- only slightly heated good olive oil in which garlic, a few diced onions and peppers have been sautéed (al peperoncino; if you add fresh or canned tomatoes, capers and/or green pepper, you can call it all'arrabiata)
 - a long-cooked tomato sauce made from good fresh or canned tomatoes with garlic, onions and lots of fresh herbs (the "sugo version")
 - at the end (and this applies to almost all variations): freshly grated or shaved Parmigiano Reggiano cheese on top ... and black pepper.

If you have tried this and are now also addicted to pasta, you can start experimenting with other and filled variations: Gnocchi, ravioli, tortellini, agnolotti, cappelletti, panzerotti ... we can easily keep ourselves busy with these until our next Italian vacation.

We have put together many different variations of boards, trays, rolls and punches for the various filled and other specialty varieties for you on the new product pages in the catalogue. We have tried them all ...



BEHIND THE SCENES:

From invention to Redecker product

In our search for new ideas, we are inspired by our everyday lives — a beautiful tool can save the day! At the same time, we are always discovering beautiful things in the world that have that special something. Basic rule: Everything that we pick up and turn into a Redecker product must also meet the requirements of a Redecker product:

- solve a task better than before
- be beautiful and practical at the same time: Form follows function!
- be simple and sustainable, i.e. consist of few components and materials that are also of natural origin and can be recycled.

HOW IS A REDECKER PRODUCT CREATED?


Often someone from the family or the company — or even a customer or neighbor — approaches us: Gernot or an employee from the workshop then withdraws with the idea and at some point comes up with a prototype. This prototype is examined, corrected, questioned, improved, worked on again and so on and so forth ... Sometimes it takes half a year before we find an idea really well rounded and worthy enough.

Then comes the technical questions: how can the item be produced, which wood for the brush body, which filling works best? How can we design the production process effectively? Only when all the questions have been answered satisfactorily are we on our way: that's what we want to produce!





Step 2: Off to the workshop to build the prototype and then optimize it step by step!

The first finished product sample is extensively tested once again. If in doubt, everything starts all over again: correction, new sample, tests. We also proceed in the same way for products that we don't manufacture ourselves: if it doesn't work perfectly, we don't take it on. An example? Our session with the fantastic new Italian pasta tools. We had a great day and a delicious dinner afterwards. Read more about it in the DIY story in this Quergebürstet.


FROM REDECKER PRODUCT TO SALE

Hooray! The product can be manufactured and is approved, blanks and tools are available. You can get started.

But wait: there is still a long way to go from this moment to the finished, available article: wood and trimming have to be ordered and storage capacities calculated. And finally, the product still has to find its way to the media via merchandise management.

But who even knows that the product exists? So far, only we do. So we contact our agency, with whom we have been working closely for more than 20 years — sometimes it almost feels like family ... They now arrange for photos to be taken of the product samples we have sent. In addition, the new samples are sent to

addition, the new samples are sent to our photographer, who sets up products and accessories in her studio in an atmospheric way and stages them beautifully – these become ambiance pages in the catalogue, but also social media posts or our beautiful posters.



Step 3: The product is beautifully arranged and photographed for the catalogue and online store.



Meanwhile, we maintain the texts and other materials for the new product in a database from which everything is published: Catalogue, online shop, product tags, brochures, data sheets ... in three different languages!

After image processing, everything ends up online — and in the new Redecker catalogue, for which the first designs and layouts are created in parallel and corrected again and again. This process takes six months — then we have print data for the new Redecker catalogue and all products are available online.

Now let's take a deep breath ... and then we'll continue. The catalogue is produced here in Germany at a medium-sized print shop that is certified with the "Blue Angel" and is CO2-neutral. During the so-called press proof, our agency partners are still at the machine and check the quality. Only then it is printed! Dispatch follows next, while we are already in intensive preparations for the Redecker trade fair stand...
